


ALL REFRIGERATOR INSTRUCTION MANUAL AT32B2



Before use, please read and follow all safety rules and operating instruction.

REFRIGERATOR SAFETY

Your safety and the safety of others are very important.

We have provided many important safety messages in this manual for your appliance. Always read and obey all safety messages.



This is the Safety Alert Symbol. This symbol alerts you to potential hazards that can kill or injure you and others. All safety messages will follow the Safety Alert Symbol and either the words "DANGER", "WARNING" or "CAUTION".



Danger means that failure to heed this safety statement may result in severe personal injury or death.



Warning means that failure to heed this safety statement may result in extensive product damage, serious personal injury, or death.

CAUTION

Caution means that failure to heed this safety statement may result in minor or moderate personal injury, property or equipment damage.

All safety messages will alert to know what potential hazard is, tell you how to reduce the chance of injury, and let you know what can happen if the instructions are not followed.

IMPORTANT SAFEGUIDES



Before the refrigerator is used, it must be properly positioned and installed as described in this manual, so read the manual carefully. To reduce the risk of fire, electrical shock or injury when using the refrigerator, follow basic precaution, including the following:



- Plug into a grounded 3-prong outlet, do not remove grounding prong, do not use an adapter, and do not use an extension cord.
- It is recommended that a separate circuit, serving only your refrigerator be provided. Use receptacles that cannot be turned off by a switch or pull chain.
- Never clean refrigerator parts with flammable fluids. These fumes can create a fire hazard or explosion. And do not store or use gasoline or other flammable vapors and liquids in the vicinity of this or any other appliance. The fumes can create a fire hazard or explosion.
- Before proceeding with cleaning and maintenance operations, make sure the power line of the unit is disconnected.
- · Do not connect or disconnect the electric plug when your hands are wet,
- Unplug the refrigerator or disconnect power before cleaning or servicing. Failure to do so can
 result in electrical shock or death.
- Do not attempt to repair or replace any part of your refrigerator unless it is specifically recommended in this manual. All other servicing should be referred to a qualified technician.




FOLLOW WARNING CALL OUTS BELOW ONLY WHEN APPLICABLE TO YOUR MODEL

- Use two or more people to move and install refrigerator. Failure to do so can result in back or other injury.
- To ensure proper ventilation for your refrigerator, choose a well-ventilated area. This unit must be installed in an area protected from the element, such as wind, rain, water spray or drips.
- The refrigerator must be installed with all electrical, water and drain connections in accordance
 with state and local codes. A standard electrical supply (100~110V AC only,60 Hz), properly
 grounded in accordance with the National Electrical Code and local codes and ordinances is
 required.
- Do not kink or pinch the power supply cord of refrigerator.
- The fuse (or circuit breaker) size should be 15 amperes.
- It is important for the refrigerator to be leveled in order to work properly. You may need to make several adjustments to level it.
- All installation must be in accordance with local plumbing code requirements.
- · Make certain that the pipes are not pinched or kinked or damaged during installations.
- Check for leaks after connection.
- Never allow children to operate, play with or crawl inside the refrigerator.
- Although the unit has been tested at the factory, due to long-term transit and storage, the first batch of cubes must be discarded.
- Do not use solvent-based cleaning agents of abrasives on the interior. These cleaners may damage or discolor the interior.
- Do not use this apparatus for other than its intended purpose.

THIS APPLIANCE IS NOT INTENDED FOR USE BY YOUNG CHILDREN OR INFIRM PERSONS UNLESS THEY HAVE BEEN ADEQUATELY SUPERVISED BY A RESPONSIBLE PERSON TO ENSURE THAT THEY CAN USE THE APPLIANCE SAFELY. YOUNG CHILDREN SHOULD BE SUPERVISED TO ENSURE THAT THEY DO NOT PLAY WITH THE APPLIANCE.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

#WARNING#

To reduce the risk of fire, electrical shock, or injury when using your appliance, follow these basic precautions:

- Read all instructions before using the refrigerator.
- DANGER or WARNING: Risk of child entrapment.

 Child entrapment and suffocation are not problems of the past. Junked or abandoned refrigerators are still dangerous. . . even if they will "just sit in the garage a few days."
- Before you throw away your old refrigerator: Take off the doors. Leave the shelves in place so that children may not easily climb inside.
- Never allow children to operate, play with, or crawl inside the refrigerator.
- Never clean refrigerator parts with flammable fluids. The fumes can create a fire hazard or explosion.
- Do not store or use gasoline or any other flammable vapors and liquids in the vicinity
 of this or any other refrigerator. The fumes can create a fire hazard or explosion.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent, or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

Before Using Your Unit

- · Remove the exterior and interior packing.
- · Check to be sure you have all of the following parts:
 - 3 Shelves
 - 1 Instruction Manual
- Before connecting the unit to the power source, let it stand upright for approximately 2 hours.
 This will reduce the possibility of a malfunction in the cooling system from handling during transportation.
- Clean the interior surface with lukewarm water using a soft cloth.

> Installing Your Unit

- This appliance is designed to be free standing; there shall be enough venting space if it is recessed or built-in.
- Place your unit on a floor that is strong enough to support the unit when it is fully loaded. To level your unit, adjust the leveling legs at the bottom of the unit.
- Allow space between the back and sides of the unit, which allows the proper air circulation to cool the compressor and condenser.
- Avoid locating the unit in moist areas.
- Plug the unit into an exclusive, properly installed-grounded wall outlet. Do not under any
 circumstances cut or remove the third (ground) prong from the power cord. Any questions
 concerning power and/or grounding should be directed toward a certified electrician or an
 authorized Products service center.
- After plugging the appliance into a wall outlet, allow the unit to cool down for 2-3 hours before
 placing food in the refrigerator compartment.

> Electrical Connection

Warning ✓

Improper use of the grounded plug can result in the risk of electrical shock. If the power cord is damaged, have it replaced by an authorized products service center.

- This unit should be properly grounded for your safety. The power cord of this unit is equipped
 with a three-prong plug which mates with standard three prong wall outlets to minimize the
 possibility of electrical shock.
- Do not under any circumstances cut or remove the third ground prong from the power cord supplied. For personal safety, this appliance must be properly grounded.
- This unit requires a standard 100~110 Volt AC /60Hz electrical outlet with three-prong ground. Have the wall outlet and circuit checked by a qualified electrician to make sure the outlet is properly grounded. When a standard 2-prong wall outlet is encountered, it is your responsibility and obligation to have it replaced with a properly grounded 3-prong wall outlet.
- The cord should be secured behind the unit and not left exposed or dangling to prevent accidental injury.
- The unit should always be plugged into its own individual electrical outlet which has a voltage rating that matches the rating label on the appliance. This provides the best performance and also prevent overloading house wiring circuits that could cause a fire hazard from overheated. Never unplug the unit by pulling the power cord. Always grip the plug firmly and pull straight out from the receptacle. Repair or replace immediately all power cords that have become frayed or otherwise damaged. Do not use a cord that shows cracks or abrasion damage along its length or at either end. When moving the unit, be careful not to damage the power cord.

> Extension Cord

Because of potential safety hazards under certain conditions, it is strongly recommended that you do not use an extension cord with this unit. However, if you must use an extension cord it is absolutely necessary that it be a 3-wire grounding type appliance extension cord having a grounding type plug and outlet and that the electrical rating of the cord be 100~110 volts and at least 15 amperes.

Reversing the Door Swing of Your Appliance

This bar fridge has been with the door hinges on the right. If you wish to change the opening direction, follow the instructions below:

- 1. Remove the upper hinge cover(6) first
- Remove the two screws (1) that hold the upper hinge (5) (right side) to the frame. Take away the upper hinge (5).
- 3. Lift the door and place it on a padded surface to prevent scratching.
- 4. Remove the two screws (8) that hold the lower hinge (2) remove the lower hinge (2).
- 5. Remove the left front leg (4) and transfer it to the right side.
- 6. Remove the hole cover plate (7) to the right side.
- Install the lower hinge (2) onto the left side of the lower frame with the two screws through the opposite two holes (8).
- 8. Set the door in its place making sure it sits on the door seat at the lower hinge (2).
- While holding the door in the closed position secure the upper hinge (5) on the top left hand side with the two screws (1) through the opposite two holes. Do not tighten the two screw (1) until the top of the door is leveled with the counter top.
- 10. Install the upper hinge cover (6) on the upper hinge.




FIGURE 1 Door opening from left side



OPERATING YOUR UNIT

Setting the Temperature Control

1.Clean the refrigerator thoroughly. Wipe the outside with a soft dry cloth, the interior with a clean moist cloth.

2.Insert the power supply cord into the socket.

3.Turn the thermostat dial to COLDEST position. Close the door and let the let the refrigerator operate for 30 minutes.

4.Reduce the thermostat to a mid-range setting COLD position on the thermostat control. COLD position is the typical setting

NOTE:

- Turning the temperature control to "OFF" position stops the cooling cycle but does not shut off the
 power to the unit.
- If the unit is unplugged, has lost power, or is turned off, you must wait 3 to 5 minutes before restarting the unit. If you attempt to restart before this time delay, the unit will not start.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- The refrigerator should be cleaned on a regular basis.
- Top performance is achieved with proper or adequate circulation around the refrigerator.
 This allows for dissipation of heat and maintains efficiency, lower power consumption and Enhanced performance.
- To attain proper performance, be sure to plug the appliance into a properly grounded 115V/60Hz outlet
- Do not modify the power cord under any circumstance to allow the unit to be plugged into a non-grounded outlet. To avoid heat damage to the power cord, please ensure that it does not come in proximity or in direct contact with the compressor of the refrigerator
- Please avoid installing the refrigerator in a location where the appliance will come in contact with water or moisture to minimize rusting of metal parts.

CAUTION:

Do not use boiling water because it may damage the plastic parts. In addition, never use a sharp or metallic instrument to remove frost as it may damage the cooling system and will void the warranty. We recommend using a plastic scraper.

- ➢ Cleaning Your Unit
- Turn the temperature control to "OFF", unplug the unit, and remove the food, shelf, and tray.
- Wash the inside surfaces with a warm water and baking soda solution. The solution should be about 2 tablespoons of baking soda to a quart of water.
- Wash the shelf and tray with a mild detergent solution.
- The outside of the unit should be cleaned with mild detergent and warm water.
- Wring excess water out of the sponge or cloth before cleaning the area of the controls, or any electrical parts.
- Wash the outside cabinet with warm water and mild liquid detergent. Rinse well and wipe dry with a clean soft cloth.

CAUTION:

Failure to unplug the unit could result in electrical shock or personal injury.

> Power Failure

Most power failures are corrected within a few hours and should not affect the temperature of your unit if you minimize the number of times the door is opened. If the power is going to be off for a longer, period of time, you need to take the proper steps to protect your food.

Vacation Time

- Short vacations: Leave the unit operating during vacations of less than three weeks.
- Long vacations: If the appliance will not be used for several months, remove all food and unplug
 the power cord. Clean and dry the interior thoroughly. To prevent odor and mold growth, leave
 the door open slightly: blocking it open if necessary.

Moving Your Unit

- Remove all the food.
- Securely tape down all loose items inside your unit.
- Turn the leveling legs up to the base to avoid damage.
- · Tape the door shut.
- Be sure the unit stays secure in the upright position during transportation. Also protect the outside of unit with a blanket, or similar item.

Energy Saving Tips

- Let hot foods cool to room temperature before placing in the unit. Overloading the unit forces the compressor to run longer.
- Be sure to wrap foods properly, and wipe containers dry before placing them in the unit. This cuts down on frost build-up inside the unit.
- Unit storage bin should not be lined with aluminum foil, wax paper, or paper toweling. Liners
 interfere with cold air circulation, making the unit less efficient.
- Organize and label food to reduce door openings and extended searches. Remove as many items as needed at one time, and close the door as soon as possible.
