

#### CONDENSATION

Moisture will form in the operating section of the unit if the unit is brought from cool surroundings into a warm room or if the temperature of the room rises suddenly. When this happens, unit's performance will be impaired. To prevent this, let the unit stand in its new surroundings for about an hour before switching it on, or make sure that the room temperature rises gradually.

Condensation may also form during the summer if the unit is exposed to the breeze from an air conditioner. In such cases, change the location of the unit.

#### HOW TO HANDLE THE LCD PANEL

- Do not press hard or jolt the LCD TV. It may cause the LCD TV glass to break and injury may occur.
- If the LCDTV is broken, make absolutely sure that you do not touch the liquid in the panel. This may cause skin inflammation.


The following symptoms are not signs of malfunction but technical limitation. Therefore we disclaim any responsibility for these symptoms.

Do not install the LCDTV near electronic equipment that produces electromagnetic waves. Some equipment placed too near this unit may cause interference.


Effect on infrared devices – There may be interference while using infrared devices such as infrared cordless headphones.

The unit emits heat when in operation. Do not place any covers or blankets on the unit, this may cause overheating. Do not block ventilation holes, or operate near radiators. Do not place in direct sunshine. When placing on a shelf 10 cm (4 inches) free space must be available around the entire unit.





#### **Setup** your TV

1. Put your TV in a place that can bear the weight of the TV.

To avoid danger, please do not assemble the TV near water or extreme heat(such as a furnace, light source, or candle.)
Do not block the ventilation on the back of the TV.

#### Connect signal source and power

2. Connect the antenna cable to the RF connection on the back or side of the TV, and/or the signal source HDMI cable to the HDMI input(s) on the rear or side of TV. Plug the TV into the wall power outlet (AC120 ~ 60Hz).

#### Turn on the TV


 While in standby mode the power indication light will be red. Press the power button on the TV or remote control. The light will change to green.



### TV Stand/Feet Installation Instructions

- 1. Open the carton and remove the TV, accessories, and the stand/feet.
- 2.To avoid damage to the TV, place on a table, face down on a soft surface. The stand/feet are attached to the TV with the provided screws.





Ensure all stand/feet screws are tightened securely.
 Do not overtighten.

Your TV will have either a Stand or Feet. Assemble accordingly.

### **Setup Wizard**

#### Setup Wizard

If your preferred language is French or Spanish, exit this Setup Wizard by pressing the Menu button, and follow the instruction on page 19 to make your language selection and re-enter the Setup Wizard from that Menu screen.

Connect a RF cable from your incoming antenna/cable jack to the TV's input labeled "ANT", and/or a HDMI cable from your signal source to the HDMI input jack.

#### **Select TV Configuration**

Press ◀ / ▶ button to select the TV Configuration to be used.

Press ▼/▲ button to select - Go to next step - and press ENTER /▶ .



#### Select Time

Press ▼ /▲ button on the remote to select the time zone, daylight saving time and time format you prefer.

Adjust the visual perception output of the entire picture; it will affect the luminousness of the picture.




